

Proposed Amendment to MU Faculty Council Rules of Order to Bring Council Rules into Compliance with UM Collected Rules and Regulations, as Amended in 2013

For discussion at Faculty Council meeting of Nov. 5, 2015

Proposed deletions are ~~struck-out~~, and proposed additions are underlined.

7. Special Rules.

- A. The Faculty Council Board of Tenured/Tenure Track Faculty. This board comprises all tenured/tenure track faculty members of Faculty Council and votes on matters pertaining specifically to tenure or to tenured/tenure track faculty.
- B. ~~A.~~ Parliamentarian. After the annual election of all of the officers, the Chair of Faculty Council shall appoint a Parliamentarian. The appointment must be approved by the Executive Committee at the first meeting of the Executive Committee. The Parliamentarian must be a member of the Council, the Parliamentarian may or may not be a Council officer. The Parliamentarian will rule on all questions regarding parliamentary procedure. In the event that the Parliamentarian cannot attend a meeting, the Chair will appoint a substitute to serve in the absence of the Parliamentarian.
- C. ~~B.~~ Librarians.
1. MU Librarians I-IV are eligible for appointment to campus committees.
 2. Faculty Council appointments to campus committees should include MU Librarians I-IV on the same basis as other faculty and MU Librarians I-IV should be polled with other faculty to list campus committee preferences.
 3. The representative(s) of librarians to the Library Committee should be selected by the MU Librarians I-IV.
 4. The MU Librarians I-IV should select a representative to attend meetings of the Faculty Council. Such representative will be non-voting, but with that exception, can engage in other Faculty Council activities, including service on Faculty Council standing committees.
- D. ~~C.~~ Recognized Organizations.
1. Any organization (a) which consists of at least 30 members of the MU faculty (active and retired), and (b) whose membership is limited to MU faculty members or is limited to MU faculty members and other members of the MU community (staff and students) may request to be recognized by Faculty Council. After determination that the organization meets the membership requirements, the request shall be granted.
 2. Upon such recognition:
 - i. The organization can select an MU faculty member as a representative to attend the open sessions of Council.
 - ii. The Chair of Council should be notified of the person selected as representative.
 - iii. The representative will receive copies of the agenda and minutes of Faculty Council meetings on the same basis as Council members.

- iv. The representative will be permitted to speak at open Council meetings on matters before Council. The representative should inform the Chair before the meeting of his or her presence. Such representative is not entitled to vote.

E. ~~D.~~ Non-tenure Track Faculty.

1. The MU ranked non-tenure track faculty are eligible for appointment to campus committees, with the exception of committees dealing specifically with tenure.
2. Faculty Council appointments to campus committees should include MU ranked non-tenure track faculty on the same basis as other faculty, with the exception of committees dealing specifically with tenure or matters specific to tenured/tenure track faculty. MU ranked non-tenure track faculty should be polled with other faculty to list campus committee preferences.
3. The MU ranked non-tenure track faculty will elect four representatives, one each from clinical, extension, research, and teaching facilities categories of faculty.
4. The ranked non-tenure faculty representative will attend meetings of the Faculty Council. Such representation will be ~~non-voting, but with that exception,~~ with the exception of matters pertaining specifically to tenure or to tenured/tenure track faculty, and can engage in all other Faculty Council activities including being members of the Council Executive Committee and service on Faculty Council Standing committees.

H. **Faculty Council on UMC Policy**

7. Full-time ranked NTT faculty campus-wide will elect four members of Faculty Council, one each from the categories of teaching, research, clinical and extension. UMC NTT faculty shall determine the election procedures for the election of NTT representatives and shall report these to the Faculty Council. Every NTT faculty is eligible for election to and service on the Council and only NTT faculty shall vote in election of NTT Faculty Council representatives. As defined in the Faculty Council Rules of Order, NTT faculty representatives are not eligible for service on the Faculty Council Board of Tenured or Tenure-Track Faculty, which votes on matters specific to tenure or tenured/tenure track (T/TT) faculty.
